



Sermon Series - Upside Down

For May the primary sermon series is going to be about how we live when the world around us seems to be Upside Down. We will look at stories from the Bible when God flipped people, communities, and the world upside down, and how in those spaces, God acted. We will strive to give hope, grace, and relief for many of us who are wondering what we will experience next.

Pastor's Notes:

Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. ISAIAH 43:18-19

The Prophet Isaiah gave us words that as Christians we use to help us focus on our new lives in Jesus. Our society has a desire for nostalgia; that's why I can't get enough of Frank's Pizza and Whitey's ice cream from the Quad Cities. They remind me of the great times I had growing up. Yet in the Bible God is looking in a forward direction. God is always evolving the relationship God has with the people and bringing it into a better place. RE-VISIONING CHILDREN'S MINISTRY


All children ages K-6th grade are welcome!

April's emphasis for UNITEkids was humility. We talked about how Jesus showed the most humble and loving act by dying to save us from our sins. Our memory verse was: *Don't do anything only to get ahead. Don't do it because you are proud. Instead, be humble. Value others more than yourselves.* Philippians 2:3 (NIV) The kids learned that they can show humility in their own lives by putting others first, asking their friends what games they want to play, offering their family members the last cookie instead of taking it, playing with a younger sibling – even when they feel like doing their own thing!

Throughout Holy Week, kids from Grace UMC and Pekin First UMC participated in the *He Is Risen* chalk art competition. There were submissions from nursery age up to high school, each sharing the Good News in a beautiful way!

After Easter, we focused on The Great Commission and praying for people to know Jesus. We made prayer chains, similar to a holiday countdown chain, and wrote the name of someone to pray for on each link in the chain. Kids were encouraged to take a link off the chain each day and pray for the person listed on the link. This is a wonderful activity to do as a family, to start family prayer time!

As you might imagine, most of our previously scheduled events have either been called off or postponed to a later date. The current state of our world has forced us to adapt how we do youth ministry, shifting much of our communication and gatherings online. We've been able to continue our usual Radical gatherings on Zoom each Wednesday night, which has been great! While not nearly the same as gathering in person, it's allowed us to still see each other and meet in a way that allows us to do a fair amount of our usual youth group meetings. In place of our Church Group Time discussions on Sundays, I've been sharing Adobe Spark pages to help guide students through our study of the Apostle Paul's missionary journeys in the book of Acts. As we've been unable to gather, our adult leader team has been doing its best to stay in touch with students and support them however we can. It's been great to get to speak with many students over the phone to hear how they're doing and let them know we're praying for them. While our students usually lead a special worship service on Easter Sunday, those plans were also altered. Instead we adapted, and our students compiled a [video](#) to share with everyone. If you saw it, I hope it helped make your Easter special as you reflected on the resurrection of Jesus!

Where God's at Work

This is a bit harder to gauge than usual given the circumstances, but we've seen God show up throughout our time apart. It's been amazing to see how our students have responded to wanting to join in our gatherings and continue to grow in their relationship with Jesus. In addition to our online meetings we've been sharing devotionals & prayer prompts on social media. We've also done a devotional as a group through the YouVersion app. It was neat to see how God was able to use our [Sunrise Service video](#) as we saw people's responses shared with us. As I was checking in with students, it was amazing to experience God using me to care for them; I was encouraged by their positive attitudes and how they are remaining hopeful in the midst of such uncertainty and change. God truly is active and moving even when we can't see Him.

Hopefully, all this will pass soon so we can get back to our usual meetings and events because we have a lot of exciting things coming up. Until then, we will continue to do online learning and gatherings. Thank you for all your prayers and support!

How do you re-open a church?

This is a major question for us and for so many other churches around the world who have been impacted by COVID19. We cannot pick the time or the amounts of people that our government and health officials give us guidance over, but we can consider some best practices. As a church, when we re-open for "normal" operations we know that there will be a new normal. You will notice us regularly cleaning higher-touch surfaces. We will likely move from a traditional passing of the plate for offering to something like what we do on Saturday night with a common location. We will make health conscious choices around communion, and we are even preparing to use multiple worship spaces at a single time for "overflow" if there are gathering number restrictions. We have learned that people need more connections, and so we will continue to grow the points of connection we have started. We have learned that this church can still accomplish much while under adversity, and so we will lean into our growing edges, offer grace and ultimately share the same old message of Jesus' love but in new and (hopefully) more profound ways. We look forward to being together again, but wait till we can trust the safety of all those who gather in Jesus name.
