



Tayauh, Tinley, and Brantly helped deliver Sunday Family Dinners in the drive-through

As we transition to in-person lessons at Children's Church, Sunday Family Dinners will be phasing out. The dinners and lessons have been a blessing to many families. Thank you to those who have donated towards purchasing groceries! And thank you to the volunteers that have helped with shopping, cooking, and clean-up.

My future goal is to provide a monthly in-person Sunday Family Dinner and activity. Once capacity limits and increased vaccination rates allow, I'd love to see the kids and families come together to have big family-style meals!

On Saturday, March 27, our youth group joined with the youth from First Methodist Church for an Easter Chalk Art Party. Here are a few of their masterpieces:



The new Pekin Outreach Center at 515 Elizabeth Street has been open for one full month: nine hours a day and seven days a week; three daily shifts manned by at least six dedicated volunteers. This has been a month of hard work, new experiences, and awesome blessings.

Between Monday, February 8th and Monday, March 8th, we had 232 visits from guests needing some form of assistance. Most of these were homeless, but all were made to feel at home.

The Center is a place where food is plentiful. There are snacks on all of the tables. Our friends bring crockpots of soup and hot meals to share. We have had donations of pizzas as well as spaghetti, salad and bread. In this one month, 257 meals have been served to our hungry clients. This count does not even include take-out meals, snack pack bags, or extra food which was bagged up for guests to take home.

In thirty days, our washer and dryer laundered 87 loads of clothes, blankets, and sheets that belong to our homeless clients. Additionally, these appliances washed many more loads of the shelter's towels. These towels were used by our grateful guests, who took a total of 79 showers. For those of you who have not yet worked a shift, let me tell you a secret. When we give our guests the opportunity to have full bellies, clean bodies and clean clothes, we give them a very good gift. Most of them are grateful and show their appreciation with respect for our workers and for our facility.

Although our first agency partner did not provide services until the middle of the month, we now have 4 agencies using our Counsel office. Last week, on two of the days, we had two different social service providers assisting our clients. Heartland Healthcare, Phoenix, City of Pekin Community Outreach and Salvation Army are partnering with Pekin Community Center. Together, our intention is to aid and assist needy clients. We have, thus far, provided referrals and assistance to 31 guests. Of those people, 4 received medical appointments and prescriptions for needed medicines. Two of our homeless guests have received COVID tests and vaccines. One of those has been accepted into the RTC shelter. During the cold nights of February, we worked with other agencies to find shelter for several of the homeless living outside. For those still unsheltered, we provided overnight hotel stays for a few. Additionally, we provided 161 supplies, from sleeping bags and propane tanks, to hats, gloves and boots.

In the last 30 days, the Pekin Outreach Center has made new friends almost daily. Due to the kindness of one donor, an airline ticket provided transportation home for one of these friends. Our guest just needed a hand up. By giving that to him, he was able to get home to family and a job in North Carolina. Those volunteers who served and talked with this client, will remember his gratitude and respect for our facility. Another guest was hiking from up North, down to Alabama. He stayed for a short time in Pekin. We offered him meals, showers, clean clothes, and a place to rest. He was always appreciative, polite, and a pleasure to have in the shelter. Several women have come through our doors, seeking assistance, food and rest. Couples living in tents have been here as well. These stories are shared with you to remind us all what our purpose is.

Homelessness comes in all forms. Poverty affects our community in so many ways. Pekin Outreach Initiative has a mission to fight poverty and prevent homelessness. We are here to help: from hot food to haircuts and from counseling to camping equipment. The Pekin Outreach Center has opened our doors to the needy, the homeless and those who seek shelter. Thanks to all of you, we can stay open and continue to help our community.


