## Ezekiel

**Author**: The Prophet Ezekiel

Date: Likely between 590-570 BCE

**Audience**: To the exiles in Babylon. They were loosing hope and Ezekiel tried to reach them in the space they had found themselves in.

**Reason**: The people were once again knowing the boot of oppression and Ezekiel spoke to offer them hope of salvation once again.

**Theme**: The rule of God over all peoples.

**Key Verse**:

**Ezekiel 39:28-29 CEB** 

They will know that I am the LORD their God when, after I made them go into exile among the nations, I gathered them to their land. I won't leave any of them behind When I pour my Spirit upon the house of Israel, I won't hide my face from them again. This is what the LORD God says.
