PASTOR'S CORNER

Thoughts, dreams, and ramblings of someone who just wants to connect you to Jesus



On April 9th we at Grace as well as Christians from around the world are going to gather in our places of worship and proclaim that the tomb did not hold our Savior. That Jesus is the fulfillment of the promises of God. That in Jesus we have life, now and eternal. On April 9th we will hold most holy the message of love that God has for all of creation.

Easter is the day for us. Easter has more power than Christmas, more significance than any other tradition, and more importance to our lives than any actions we can make. Easter also hits us right between the eyes. When the followers of Jesus had given their lives to follow him, they thought that a preferred version of their futures was coming true. It was, just not as they had envisioned it. Between the crucifixion and Easter morning was a wild and painful period of waiting and learning about oneself. The followers of Jesus did not awake like you and I do on our Easter mornings.

On the first Easter morning, the followers of Jesus didn't have the painful choice of what pastel shirt and tie combo would look best in the family photos at church. They woke scared, alone, tired, angry, and hurt. They would hear of the resurrection with the most profound hopefulness and skepticism that anyone could mix together. They woke that first Easter morning having heard but not understood Jesus.

I share all of this because I truly feel that today this wild mixture is just as relevant to us as it was to the first disciples of Jesus.

We have a world that is profoundly hurt, afraid, confused and almost everyday feels like it is simply not going as we had dreamed it would. This gives me hope. This gives me hope because this is exactly where Jesus meets those whom he calls. Jesus meets us in the mess of this life and in a way that is more profound than any of us can make any singular worship experience. Jesus transforms our fear, anger and, doubt into joy, love and relief.

So, if this is how powerful Easter is, then what are we doing with it?

What are we going to do with the most important message that the world has ever known? I don't know about you, but I don't want to treat it just like another day, one where I get to eat too large of a dinner and try and look my best for others. I want to treat it like the profound opportunity that it is. I want to have it hit me in ways that never leave me the same. I want to share it with the same conviction that the first followers of Jesus did, with conviction that was unafraid of the consequences of the world and instead celebrating in the already felt resurrecting love of Christ.

Friends, Easter is coming... indeed it is here with us. Let us live like this message is hitting us afresh each day! (rii Surinson

They will stay there for the rest of the school year.





Who are the Grace Readers? (Miriam Circle)

In 2010, a group of women from Grace United Church decided to find a service project. Since many of them were retired teachers and several had taught at CB Smith they contacted the school principal there to find ways to help students. It was decided to focus on kindergarten students and encourage reading.

The women met with the teachers for suggestions. From that meeting came the idea to make a colorful child-like fabric book bag for each child in kindergarten. It was also decided to have a fundraiser at the church annually to make money to provide each teacher with a check for Scholastic books in the fall and again in the spring. The teachers would use it to get books for each child both times.

These Grace Readers also were invited to come and read individually with kindergarten students with books provided by the teachers. They went once a month. Since COVID, they have not been able to go and read or listen to the kindergarteners, but they continue to make the book bags and provide funds for a fall and spring book for each child.

During the years they also volunteered to be "grandparents" for students who didn't have any to come to Grandparents Day, as well as helping when the PTA used to have a Christmas store for students to buy inexpensive Christmas presents.

During the years that we were not allowed in the school, we made a monthly card for the kindergarten classes encouraging them to read.

We returned to the kindergarten classes in January this year to read with the kindergartners. We would love to have more members who are willing to read with kindergarten children and to sew book bags. We meet once a month at CB Smith School the third Wednesday of the month from 10:55 to noon. The dates we have left this school year are April 19 and May 17. Sign-Up for Community Rewards

Just to let you know we have 22 households entered into the Kroger community rewards program! These families have earned Grace Church \$53.91 for their purchases from October 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

If you shop at Kroger's and you have a Kroger's card, please take a few minutes to sign up for this program. Every little bit helps. Our organization is listed under GRACE UMC (EJ122). This program does not take away from points earned towards fuel points or their other programs.

In the Kroger app, you will touch the three lines at the top of the home page, go to rewards and then select community rewards. Under community rewards type in Grace UMC. This enrolls you in their program. This is also where you go to remove enrollment.

Friends,

At the beginning of 2020 our church was gifted what is known as a Level 2 energy audit. This was through one of the faith-based energy and environmental advocacy groups that has partnered with United Methodist Churches in the Midwest. They gave us a great report on changes we could make that would quickly lower our energy usage without really affecting our programs. Some of these were really small (our hot water heater was actually over the level temp, so a reasonable lower rate would be safer and cheaper). Some were to get free and reduced pricing for LED upgrades that we have done throughout our buildings. A major one that we are nearly complete with is the application for a Grant through the Illinois Solar For All program. This program is funded by the energy producers to help them meet their required renewable energy development in what are known as Environmental Justice and Economic Justice areas. In either of those areas, the Illinois Solar for All program will review requests for grants to install solar systems on not-for-profits and other similar organizations. The organizations then do not have upfront costs, they see between 60-85% reductions in their electrical costs and participate in a "win, win" situation.

Our church applied for this grant as our facilities qualify as an Economic Justice area Congregation. We learned that we have received the grant and will have a solar system installed on the Family Life Center steel roof in the fall of 2023. We don't anticipate much savings in 2023 but we are looking forward to this work that will begin in August and conclude by the beginning of November. We will be helping create more renewable energy in our area as well as benefiting from that energy creation. The system that they are installing will generate an estimated 116kW (that's a lot) and go a long way in helping Grace fulfill its mission for many years to come.

This system will be like any other traditionally purchased system in that it will be insured and supported by warranties. The work will be done by professionals in a timely manner. It will be installed only over our steel roof so the sanctuary tile roof will not be touched. We feel that this is a very promising program and potentially the entry way for us to Partner with Illinois Solar for All in other ways that uplift our congregation and the people of Pekin.
