PASTOR'S CORNER

Thoughts, dreams, and ramblings of someone who just wants to connect you to Jesus



I am going to start with a prayer request from all of the church. I am asking for your prayers for myself, for the delegates from the Illinois Great Rivers Annual Conference of the UMC, for the United Methodist Church, and for the Gathering of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church in Charlotte, N.C., April 23 through May 3.

The United Methodist Church is a global church in form and function. We have spent hundreds of years sharing the message of the love of Jesus Christ to the world. We have done this through preaching, teaching, and missional service. This work has given hope to countless people, offered healing to the masses and been able to build a church not only for Pekin but for people in North America, South America, Europe, Asia, and Africa.

As a part of the ongoing visioning that God is always doing through his people, the church spends time in prayer and in what we call Holy Conferencing. The General Conference is that international body that functions like a very large version of our church leadership board and a body similar to our United States legislative branch. Every Annual Conference elects delegates based on their size. Our Illinois Great Rivers Conference has five clergy and five laity who have been elected by their peers to represent us. I am one of those five clergy delegates from our Annual Conference who will be serving on behalf of the entire church.

When we gather, there are 1100 pieces of legislation that have been submitted to this body. Every person who is a member of the UMC is able to submit legislation and some people truly take great sums of time to make sure we are always perfecting our denominational polity found in our Book of Discipline.

The hot button items are threefold. The first one is what is known as our Revised Social Principles. The Social Principles are the 41 pages of our church attempting to understand the nature of our faith in relationship to the standard issues of the world. The topics involve the Natural World, Nurturing Community, Social Community, Economic Community, Political Community, World Community and a Social Creed.

Following that, we will focus on Worldwide Regionalization. This is a petition set that is focused on keeping those things that are core, into the General Conference and the allowance for the United States to have the same liberties that the rest of the world has on adaptations to our Book of Discipline. This would bring parity to the countries, and this would take some of our US focused issues (such as American Pensions) out of the General Conference and into regional conversations. We would also see a reduction in global expenses to maintain our system today.

The last piece is the removal of restrictive language on LGBTQIA persons. This was the debate over the past 40+ years that lead 25% of the US UMC churches toleave the denomination last year. The proposals that are before the Conference would remove any restrictive language that would bar the church from being in ministry to, and with persons who identify as gay or lesbian. These changes would not mandate things such as weddings, just like I am not required to perform any weddings I am uncomfortable with today, but it would instead end the prohibitions that today would see the end of my clergy credentials if I participated in such a wedding today.

These by far are not all of the issues before us, but these are the ones that will hold the most weight in the room of the body that gathers and among news media agencies from across the globe. This is a strange mixture of spiritual practice as well as political process. There will be life uplifting moments as well as truly heart-breaking decisions that will be made. Our hope will be always found in the life-changing message of the resurrecting power of Jesus Christ. Ultimately that will always be what we prayerfully desire to engage.

So I covet your prayers. For me, and for my family as I am gone. If you have a moment, check in on Cori and the kids., and if you see me on May 5 in church (I hope to be back), don't give me too hard of a time if I fall asleep.

Anger is such a big, powerful emotion. When we're angry about things that matter, our anger can lead us toward action. Anger can even inspire us to make the world a better place! But other times, our anger can lead us to make choices that are harmful to ourselves or others.

There's no escaping situations or people who make us angry, but how we respond when we're angry is up to us. So, if we can't completely avoid getting angry, what can we do?

In this **four-week series**, we'll explore four passages of Scripture from both the Old and New Testaments that might challenge our view on anger. We'll learn practical skills like when we feel angry, pause to ask God why. We'll see how, when we're angry, Jesus shows us how to respond. And in our anger, we'll be challenged to show grace and not get hurtful.

What: A once every 4 years meeting of the international policy and visioning body of the United Methodist Church. This is the only body that can speak for the UMC as a whole and the only body that can edit our Book of Discipline, the policy book of the church.

When: April 23 through May 3

Where: Charlotte, North Carolina (also live streaming through various church pages)

Why: To help continue the conversations (Holy Conferencing) of the church so that it might live into the mission of the church: "To make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."
