# PASTOR'S CORNER

Thoughts, dreams, and ramblings of someone who just wants to connect you to Jesus



Summertime is a time for family, fun, fellowship, and picnics. Throughout the summertime, I love to hear the stories of everyone's vacations. The experiences that people have and the memories that they get to make as family is a great joy not only to that family but the greater community. When we know that our community can thrive, we can truly celebrate that shared abundance. We know that people are taking part in the healing work of Sabbath time. We see the types of joy that God has for us all.

One of the other ways that this type of joy and celebration can be experienced in the summer is through the opportunities to gather that are present to us. This summer with the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pekin, we will have many chances for the community to gather as a collective. We will get time to honor our history and dream the God-sized dreams that we pray for our future. These extra times of community, coupled together with our traditional celebration events can be wonderful times of the witness of the gospel of Jesus to be a part of our collective offering to the community.

We are called to be a church that is very much an active and life-giving part of the community that God has us planted in. We know that our ministries are already giving life through the school district and through our generosity in the pantry. We also know that there is always going to be a need for us to do more. It is not always the more of serving more people with groceries or reading more books to children (though those will always be important). We also have the obligation of our faith to offer to all people a relationship with Jesus. We do this by having actions that help others ask questions about the type of love and joy that is found in our hearts. It's a joy and a love that is very much like that summertime joy I talked about in the beginning of this note. It's a familial love that is supportive, instructive, and enjoying the gift of being together.

So, this summer I want to challenge all of us to be together as much as we can. Come to church, join in the service of families at VBS. Worship in the shared service and potluck on July 28th. But also, go to the park for the Marigold Festival, listen to live music at the pavilion, be in one of the many parades that will happen and represent the Gospel of Jesus, and the people of Grace well as we are community together!

#### **Budget Update**

We are not quite done with the first half of the year in our accounting, but we are here in terms of our time. With the May financials we find ourselves behind in the budget, as we often do at this time of the year. Many of our yearly expenses that are fixed are found in Q1, and we find that we have always had our strongest giving at the end of the year with December giving.

2024's total budget is \$488,536. Year to date we have spent \$200,053 on budgeted expenses and our total income has been \$176,956. Though Operating fund giving through tithes and offerings is down about 4% year-to-date, we continue to see significant support in our digressional giving to the various Fund accounts and support to projects like our pantry, the new trailer, and the elevator sprinkler system we are required to install this year.

Though we always desire to be as near a perfect spending-to-income ratio, we continue to feel confident in the call to service that is represented in our budget and we know that with continuing support we can meet our funding goals to embrace our missional work.

#### **Maintenance Updates**

The facilities continue to provide us with the opportunity to serve and volunteer in the life of the church! Thank you to the various men and women who continue to make our grounds and buildings look good and function well.

This month we have seen some maintenance work done to the HVAC; most of this work has been standard issue service and repairs. We have a grounds team that received support from the Youth Ministry as they cleaned up the flower beds for the year and spread mulch. Inside the building, we updated signage on doors as was requested by the local fire inspector. The kitchen was renewed in its food service license so that we can host non-church functions again. We have been fixing various bathroom fixtures that have been struggling after many years of Pekin's hard water. We are looking into the last of our fluorescent lighting with all the round can lights in the lobby and chapel areas for LED updates as well as looking at possible upgrade to the security lighting to LED for longer battery backup life as well as cheaper maintenance over the long term. We also found fixes for some of our in-house screens as we had been experiencing some broadcasting issues following one of the downtown brownouts.

We are also completing the bid process for the sprinkler and alarm system for the elevator. This year the inspector informed us that they are no longer allowing us to maintain the elevator in its original state without adding this system. Bids are coming in now, so far, they appear lower than we first estimated. We are now hopeful that this can be completed for around \$20,000 instead of our original estimate of between \$30-50,000.

We continue to move forward with facility repairs and give thanks for all the volunteer hours that continue to keep our costs down so that we might continue to do excellent ministry in the community.





## A TIME TO DANCE

It's not an original idea to say that there are two kinds of people in the world—those who think negatively and those who approach life positively. But this year's Annual Conference left me with a very "glass half full" kind of feeling. A Time To Dance was the theme as legislation was passed, a budget was approved, reports were given, the bishop gave his address, we sang, we prayed, we listened, I was encouraged by a spirit of peace, joy, and determination to continue to transform the world and spread the message of Christ. All of the legislative action and business of AC can be found on the IGRC website if you are interested in details.

A highlight of the conference for me was the address by Chantel Corrie, the director of Midwest Mission, an arm of our conference that works to support and supply missions across the globe. Members of our own Grace church have traveled to Springfield to do a variety of tasks there at the center over the years, such as preparing health kits or food packets to be sent to areas around the world. Last year the Midwest Mission sent \$6.4 million in aid to help people in developing countries. As Chantel spoke, her enthusiasm and "can do" fervor just jumped out and grabbed me. She asked "What is keeping you from doing what God is calling you to do?" Then she challenged us to do 4 things—BEFRIEND, BELONG, BELIEVE, and BECOME. We can all have conversations to Befriend people. Then we can invite them to engage further or link them to others to help them Belong. When these relationships progress (yes, we are building relationships), there may be that moment to share your story or ask their story, maybe a God moment, talking about what you <u>Believe</u>. Finally, they may choose to <u>Become</u> part of the Christian experience as you pray, serve, share with them.

I left Annual Conference with a sense of renewed commitment to take more steps to reach out to those around me and befriend and build relationships. The goal isn't necessarily to gain members for Grace. The goal is to build relationships and share the love of God. It is a time to dance and rejoice in the love of our Father, a message of hope and grace for our world.
