

PASTOR'S CORNER

Thoughts, dreams, and ramblings of someone who just wants to connect you to Jesus



In the Christmas story there is a moment where the skies open and a Heavenly Choir proclaims the birth of Jesus to the people of the Earth. Can you picture that? You're one of the shepherds who are out, just doing your normal thing, when the skies fill with such a powerful proclamation that you would then willingly leave your responsibilities to go and see what they were proclaiming. It would have truly been an overwhelming invitation that would leave you forever changed.

In the life of the church, we have the opportunity to join in that Heavenly Choir. Not by singing but by proclaiming that Jesus is here and that you will forever be changed by His presence in your life.

Christmas is the perfect time to join in sharing that message because Christmas is the season when most of the population is receptive to the good news of Jesus. Though we have done a lot of work secularizing the Christmas season in America, we still trace the roots of the season to our Gospel hope. Because Christmas will always be grounded in that hope, the messages will always resonate that we value love, generosity, and the saving of all people. Even those who don't fully understand what they are hearing have this hope.

Consider the poor shepherds for just a moment. They were likely awestruck by the moment, but did they fully understand who Jesus was in the moment? Did they fully understand who Jesus was after they went and saw the baby? Not likely on both accounts. It is very likely that they had hope. They hoped that God's power and love would be felt and known in their lives. They didn't become Jesus' first disciples on that day of his birth, but they knew that what was behind that moment and that encounter was important, so they leaned into the moment and were changed by it.

At Christmas we hope that the moments we take as proclaimers of the Gospel of Jesus can have that same impact. We know that there is a world that is hungry for a message of real life. We know that the lights, tinsel, etc, are temporary (even that choir was temporary) but we know that what it represents is something worth searching for.

So, this Christmas season. Be bold! Raise your voice and invite anyone you know who is just going through this life, doing their normal routine, and ask them to drop what they are doing to find a true way of living.


